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

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# Pillar I: EXCELLENT SCIENCE: reinforcing and extending the excellence of the Union's science base

#### European Research Council (ERC)

- Supports excellence in frontier research
  through a bottom-up, individual-based, pan-European competition
  - Independent Scientific Council
  - Excellence as the only criterion,
  - Support for the individual scientist no networks!
  - Global peer-review
  - Bottom-up, all fields of science

#### Marie-Sklodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA)

- Equipping researches with new knowledge and skills through mobility and training
  - International mobility
  - Bottom up, open to all domains of R&I
  - Open to the whole world

  - Participation of both academic and nonacademic (private) sector organisations

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### Pillar III: European Innovation Council, EIC

Support to the full innovation cycle from **research and development** to **rapid scale** up of innovative technologies and companies (mainly start-ups and SMEs) at international level.

- Pathfinder (ex-FET): early stage research of breakthrough technologies by a multidisciplinary consortium
- **Transition:** develop market readiness of most potential research findings open only to Pathfinder or ERC PoC projects
- Accelerator (ex SME Instrument): finalize the technology, commercialisation and scale-up by single innovative SMEs

Funding mainly through **bottom-up schemes** – **Open Calls** 

All instruments also contribute to **thematic priorities**: Health & Biotech, Digital, Energy, Climate & Environment – *Challenge Calls*





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### Integration of social sciences and humanities



#### What & why?

- Global challenges too complex
- Not overcome by a single scientific discipline
- Technical solutions not enough.
- Lasting societal impacts rely on insights from social sciences and the humanities.
- Improved integration of SSH expected to lead to stronger societal impact, broaden citizen engagement and a better future.



### Integration of social sciences and humanities: What's new in Horizon Europe?

### SSH integration is already a cross-cutting principle under Horizon 2020

- SSH-flagging of topics
- Yearly monitoring of SSH integration

#### In Horizon Europe SSH integration will be

- More holistic (applying across the entire program and over the entire cycle)
- More explicit (expected societal impacts clearly set out)
- More forceful (explicitly evaluated and followedup)



### SSH(A) in Horizon Europe

#### **Dedicated Cluser to SSH(A)**

#### Cluster 2: Culture, Creativity and Inclusive Society

- Dedicated to the human, social and societal aspects of EU-funded R&I
- Predominantly SSH-focused

#### Intergration of SSH(A)

- Integration of social sciences and humanities (SSH) in **all clusters**
- Including all missions and partnerships
- A principle **through the programme cycle**.
- SSH are a key constituent of research and innovation, especially regarding the twin green and -digital transitions.



### Integration of ssh(a) – cross-cluster synergies

#### Cluster 1 (health):

health related socio-economic inequalities, adaptation of public health systems to societal challenges (e.g. demographics), health economics and economic models, cost-effectiveness, fiscal sustainability and accessibility of healthcare.

#### Cluster 3 (security):

countering radicalisation and extremism, building societal resilience to disinformation and fake news, improving response to domestic violence, and protecting cultural heritage.

#### Cluster 4 (digital, industry,

**space)**: qualitative research on the nature of job transformations for industry 4.0/5.0, the analysis of human-machines interactions, business models for sustainable developments, citizens' participation and public engagement in industrial technologies, as well as cultural heritage research.

#### Cluster 5 (climate):

engaging and enabling citizens to participate in the clean energy transition, from planning to decisionmaking and implementation.

#### Cluster 6 (food, bioeconomy, environment):

improving rural well-being and longterm socio-economic prospects, promoting and valorising cultural heritage and developing innovative cultural and creative industries.
